Contribution to Society	Does the occupation allow you to contribute to the betterment of the	
	world or your community—or the world—in some way.	
Competition	Engaging in activities as part of your work that put your abilities against	
	another person's; win-and-lose outcomes at stake.	
Creativity	Engaging in work that allows you to use your creativity and ingenuity.	
	(Does not have to be "artistic" in the traditional sense.)	
Flexible Hours	Being able to set your own hours, or not having to abide by a strict 40-	
	hour work week. Being able to work outside traditional 8-to-5 hours.	
Fulfillment	The degree to which your occupation leaves you feeling fulfilled at the	
	end of the day/week.	
High Income	The extent to which the occupation yields a high monetary salary.	
Independence	Does your job allow you to work independently on your various tasks and	
	projects, without a high degree of supervision?	
Leadership	Having a job that provides opportunities to lead others, assign duties, and manage others.	
Leisure	Having a job that allows time to engage in leisure activities.	
Location	Choosing an occupation based on geographic factors like the	
	environment, city size, weather, or proximity to family.	
Continuing Education	A job which includes ongoing education and learning as part of the work	
	expectations.	
Pleasant Co-Workers	Working with people who you enjoy spending time with, either in or out	
	of the office.	
Prestige	An occupation that affords a high degree of prestige and respect; an	
	occupation that is traditionally seen as impressive.	
Security	Having a job that is secure—a low probability of changes or loss of job.	
Variety	A job that involves a large variety of tasks, skills, and activities.
