



# UC Merced External Relations Data Confidentiality Statement and Use Agreement


In your capacity as a UC Merced employee (faculty, staff, or student), agent, or vendor, you may be responsible for handling sensitive and confidential data pertaining to individuals and organizations that interact with the University. This information (for example, name, address, telephone number, employer, email address, giving history, wealth information, education, etc.) is maintained in the External Relations constituent database. The Raiser's Edge and auxiliary systems, including but not limited to the Anthology Encompass platform, ResearchPoint, LiveAlumni, RelSci and various profiles and summaries as compiled by the Prospect Research Unit.

All University employees (including part-time, temporary, contractual, and student assistants), authorized agents (i.e consultants and volunteers), and vendors are required to safeguard and always ensure privacy of all sensitive and confidential data, including any communications channels, (i.e., faceto-face, mail, email, marketing communications, social media, and telephone outreach).

#### Information Release


External Relations data and information may NOT be released unless with prior written authorization of the External Relations Data Steward (or their designate), in which case information in the form of lists, labels, reports, and any other media may be made available ONLY to University personnel, campus partners, or authorized vendors with a direct University liaison in support of official, approved University business. All parties that handle University information will be held accountable for the safety of the data. It is the responsibility of the requestor to ensure the confidentiality of that information. Any questions regarding access to data should be directed to the appropriate External Relations Data Steward (or their designate).
