


INVOLVEMENT

CLERY AUDIT

- Jeanne Clery, a freshman at Lehigh University, was raped and murdered in her dormitory on April 5, 1986. Jeanne's parents believed the University had failed to share vital information with its students regarding campus safety.
- Clery Act (1990): a federal law requiring colleges and universities that receive federal financial aid to disclose certain crime statistics and policies regarding safety and security programs on campus.

- Obtained Admission Data (2019-2021) from UCM and UCOP
 - Identified and isolated all admitted students
- Donor Data (Jan 2018-Aug 2021) from UCM External Relations
 - Included in data is total donations & pledged amounts
 - Isolated large donations (above 10k) made to UCM
- Ran an Admission & Donation Analytic
 - Ensures that the admitted student had no outside influence from any sort of large contribution/donation made to the University.
 - IA accounts for foreign influence, bribery, and SMG relationships.
